Randolph Elected 2010 MTA First Vice President

Delta Charter Township, Mich.—East China Charter Township (St. Clair Co.) Supervisor Jack Randolph was elected first vice president of the Executive Committee of the Michigan Townships Association (MTA) Board of Directors at the Association's 57th Annual Educational Conference, held Jan. 27-29, 2010, at DeVos Place in Grand Rapids.

Randolph served as trustee of East China Charter Township from 1994 until being elected supervisor in 2000. He has served on the MTA Board of Directors since 2005.

Serving and working with local officials in his area are among the highlights of Randolph's township career. "Among my most rewarding experiences in township government has been meeting all the township officials and employees who do more with less—and do it well," said Randolph, who further stated that "helping townships survive with a shrinking dollar" is among the priorities for both himself and the Association.
